4-4. Status update & report from California Advocacy, LLC with respect to legislative matters.

Mr. Sanchez reported SB 549 (Newman) continued to be located in the Assembly Governmental Organization Committee, with a hearing not yet scheduled for its consideration in that committee. As a 2-year bill, SB 549 has eligibility for movement at any point in time up until mid-August 2024.

Mr. Pineda also reported that Assemblymember Aguiar-Curry gutted & amended her AB 863 legislation, as expected. The bill is in the Senate and now focuses on cardroom issues, on behalf of tribal interests. In addition, it is anticipated Assemblymember Aguiar-Curry will introduce an additional cardroom-related bill via AB 2886. Like both SB 549 & AB 863, AB 2886 is a two-year bill and eligible for consideration up until mid-August 2024 but must move from their current locations by July 3, 2024.

The JPA will continue to monitor all three bills, as well as continue its ongoing communications with members of their respective Committees. The board was advised that due to the numerous cardroom-related bills, we anticipate engaging in person in Sacramento in the first or second week of June, or during any committee hearings on these bills.

Mr. Garza noted that for prior Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget, the JPA met its revenue goals. He also reported that due to expenditure discipline throughout the year, the JPA is forecasted to end the budget year with a slight budget surplus of approximately \$20,000.

Mr. Garza then summarized proposed FY 2024-2025 budget and detailed staff's assessment and recommendations on how to invest resources and maximize return for the JPA, its members and partner cardrooms.

Proposal for a balanced budget for FY 2023-2024:

- 1) Balanced annual budget at \$227.500.
- 2) No increase in fees for member cities (\$157,500).
- 3) No increases in fees for cardrooms (\$70,000).
- 4) No increases in Expenses (\$227,500).
- 5) Board member stipends: No increase.
- 6) Executive Director: No increase.
- 7) Operational Expenses: No increase.
- 8) Legal Services: No increase.
- 9) Financial Services: No increase.
- 10) Legislative Lobbying: No increase.
- 11) Communications: No increase.
- 12) Contingency: Remain at \$0, to ensure a lean and effective budget.

RE: OPPOSE - HR 6859: Gabrielino/Tongva Nation Recognition Act of 2023 (Kamlager-Dove - Rep-D-CA-37).

Dear Chairs Westerman and Hageman, and Ranking Members Grijalva and Leger-Fernandez:

The California Cities for Self-Reliance Joint Powers Authority (JPA) is a coalition of local cities located in Los Angeles and Orange Counties in southern California. The JPA is chartered under California state law to represent the interests of the citizens, local businesses, and their employees in our member communities. We are writing you today to express our serious concerns about and opposition to H.R. 6859, legislation introduced by Rep. Sydney Kamlager-Dove which has been referred to the Natural Resources Committee and the Subcommittee on Indian Affairs.

HR 6859 would legislatively grant federal recognition to a group of individuals in the Los Angeles/Orange County area who call themselves the Gabrieleno/Tongva Nation. As you aware, federal recognition bestows many important rights and benefits to tribal nations including governmental powers, eligibility for numerous federal programs, and the ability to have land taken into trust by the federal government on their behalf. As such, recognition is not a matter to be taken lightly, granted indiscriminately or for political reasons, or given to those unworthy of that status. It should only be conveyed to those tribal groups who have demonstrated with thorough documentation that they are deserving of federal recognition.

A specific set of procedures has been in place at the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) for many decades whereby tribal groups can petition for federal recognition. This process is open to any group who wishes to petition. Petitioners must meet a set of standards that have been established by federal regulation. These standards include well-defined criteria whereby a petitioner must demonstrate their continuous uninterrupted history as an Indian tribal government with authority over its people who have documented Indian tribal ancestry. The BIA's Office of Federal Acknowledgement (OFA) has been tasked with evaluating these petitions and is staffed with teams of highly trained professionals in genealogy, anthropology, history, and other disciplines whose expertise is unmatched. These individuals have the unique capacity found nowhere else in the federal government to make unbiased and fact-based determinations on the validity of a group's claim to be an Indian tribe.

The group of individuals claiming to be the Gabrieleno/Tongva Nation is eligible to go through the OFA recognition process, yet they have instead chosen to come directly to Congress to seek recognition through legislation. By doing this, the Gabrieleno/Tongva group is deliberately choosing to avoid the established process for recognition at OFA and the scrutiny of their claim to be a tribe by the experts most capable of evaluating that claim. We urge you in the strongest terms to reject this attempt to bypass regular procedures and for you to encourage this group to participate in the normal OFA process that other tribal groups have gone through.

We would also be remiss if we did not point out that HR 6859 is not the first attempt by this group of individuals to bypass the OFA process and obtain federal recognition by other means. A number of years ago, they attempted to gain federal status by seeking a "reaffirmation" by the Secretary of the Interior that they were a tribe – attempting to bypass not just OFA but Congress as well. The "reaffirmation" would have been done with no evaluations or standards at all beyond the Secretary simply adding their name to a list of federally recognized tribes. The only time reaffirmation was ever used it resulted in an investigation by the DOI Inspector General and a new policy that going forward this procedure would never be used again.

These multiple attempts to bypass regular procedures and accepted standards at OFA by the Gabrieleno/Tongva should not inspire much confidence by the Committee that their claims to be an Indian tribe have validity. Nor should the tribe's own statements in a December 23, 2023 story in the Los Angeles Times entitled "Tribal bid for federal recognition could pave way for L.A. area's first Indian casino" in which the leaders of the group openly admit that their goal in seeking recognition is to open a massive casino somewhere in urban Los Angeles County.

Better than any other Committee in Congress, the Natural Resources Committee knows that federal recognition should be about acknowledging the government-to-government relationship between legitimate tribes and the federal government, not the desires of a group of individuals who view recognition as a vehicle to casino riches. For these reasons, we urge you to reject HR 6859 and any other attempts by groups to avoid the scrutiny of the OFA process and that you refer the Gabrieleno/Tongva group to the appropriate procedures at the BIA.
